#### **Meeting Minutes**

## Community Room, Annville Free Library, and Remotely Via Zoom (Hybrid Meeting) Tuesday, September 16, 2025

The meeting opened at 5:30 PM with a special presentation by Bill Osburn titled "Quittapahilla Creek near Bellegrove, PA: Nutrient & Sediment trends," on using statistics to better understand the monitoring data the QWA is producing. A pdf file of the PowerPoint presentation is accessible on the Monitoring page of the QWA website, at <a href="https://www.quittiecreek.org/monitoring.html">https://www.quittiecreek.org/monitoring.html</a> The presentation ended around 6:30 pm, followed, by a pizza break, followed by our regular meeting starting at 7:00 pm.

1. Minutes. The minutes of the August 19, 2025 meeting were circulated electronically before the meeting and approved by consensus. #### 2. Monitoring Program

#### A. Fieldwork updates.

- 1) October fieldwork. Katie reported that she will send out a Doodle poll to determine the best dates for our October fieldwork.
- 2) Biological Monitoring. Katie reported that the LCCD intends to undertake macroinvertebrate sampling in the Quittie watershed this fall and is coordinating with Lebanon Valley College for an intern to undertake the sample analysis.
- 3) Safety Meeting. It was agreed that our October 21 regular monthly meeting should be preceded by a meeting from 6-7 pm focusing on safety protocols for our fieldwork to minimize risk to our volunteers. Mike will include that in the invitation to the October meeting.

#### B. Equipment updates

 Multiparameter sonde. Katie reported that the handheld device for the multiparameter sonde has been repaired under warranty by the manufacturer and is being returned to us.

- **2) Solinst Sensors.** Bob reported that the Solinst sensors continue to record data at five of our monitoring sites (the sixth, Q2, has a USGS monitoring station), and that the data is now being uploaded directly into our Water Quality Portal.
- 3) ISCO auto-samplers. Bob reported that all the bottles and hoses for both auto-samplers, Kay and Lee, have been cleaned using the rigorous protocols developed by Kent Crawford and approved by PA-DEP (see Appendix 1 in the Aug 19 meeting minutes). On Wed, Sept 3, Bob, Katie, and Mike spent three hours in the LVC Biology lab cleaning the 72 sample bottles (24 for each unit, plus 24 extras), and this morning cleaned and prepared the hoses. Now we only await a forecasted and suitable high-rain event.
- 4) Sieve Bucket for Macroinvertebrate Sampling. Mike reported that he purchased the sieve bucket from Forestry Supplies, Inc., at a cost of \$145.15, using his personal credit card. He reported that at next month's meeting he will bring the QWA checkbook and write himself a check for that amount under the watchful eyes of other QWA members.

#### C. Data Management

- 1) Meeting with new volunteer. Mike & Bob met with new volunteer Mia Bucher on Mon Sept 15 to introduce her to our Water Quality Portal and data management needs.
- **2)** Macroinvertebrate Sampling Raw Data. Mike reported no updates in the effort to secure the raw macro data from LVC graduate Charles Katona.
- 3) Job description for LVC intern. Bob reported that he will be revising the draft job description for an LVC student intern on data management. Job descriptions for interns doing other types of work were also discussed. It was agreed that we could fruitfully engage the services of student interns in the following areas: (1) Macroinvertebrate sample analysis, (2) Data management, (3) Marketing, and (4) Literature review and "report cards" on the Quittie data

#### General:

We are still waiting on DEP to give us information on the upcoming MS4 permit term, beyond the partial draft material presented for comment thus far, in January.

#### Floodplain Restoration SQ1 Phase 1 (East of 22nd Street):

Still growing in – this is it's second year post-construction. The Consortium has a maintenance contract in place with LandStudies for this year and next.

#### SQ1 Phase 2 (West of 22<sup>nd</sup> Street)

To be constructed in 2026 as part of the adjacent bridge realignment.

#### Floodplain Restoration SQ6 (Dairy Road to Mill Street):

Design work has begun, involving additional survey and stream evaluation. A new owner has bought a key property along Mill Street, which was previously unresponsive. The new owners appear to be more amenable to the idea of the project, and if this summary is being read by Kara, we are currently meeting with them.

#### Lions Lake Shoreline Stabilization:

Project is substantially complete. A maintenance bond is in place. Several punch list items are to be completed in the fall and winter, being (among others) fall overseeding and re-planting of certain livestakes areas, respectively.

#### Monitoring Program

- a. Fieldwork. Katie Hollen organized fieldwork days covering all six monitoring stations on Aug 12 and Aug 13, with volunteers Alexis Biondi, Bob Connell, Chris Salvas, Michael Schroeder, and Gary Zelinske.
- b. ISCO auto-samplers. On Wed Sept 3, Katie Hollen, Bob Connell and Michael Schroeder washed & prepared the bottles for the two auto-samplers. The hoses need to be washed, after which the two units will be ready to deploy for a high-rain event.
- Solinst sensors for five monitoring stations are actively recording data. That data is being directed to the QWA's cloud-based platform.
- NFWF Small Watershed Planning and Technical Assistance Grant for capacity-building: a "summit" meeting was held on Mon Aug 25 at the LCCD office with representatives of the various organizations involved in the POWR-facilitated NFWF grant. We are approaching the final stages of the grant period.
