The meeting opened at 7:00 PM.

2. Monitoring Program

A. Fieldwork updates

- 1)** Bill's printed field safety cards with site addresses and information for monitoring volunteers to keep in their vehicles and with equipment are yet to be distributed.
- 2)** Katie reported that our December round of routine monitoring will be postponed until January due to inclement weather and busy schedules. She will email a Doodle poll to all volunteers early in the new year.

B. Equipment updates

- 1) Solinst Sensors.** Bob reported that the Solinst sensor at BM1 is not working and is being sent back to Solinst for repair or replacement; that the sensor at K1 needs its battery replaced; and that the sensor at Q1 in Cleona needs an antenna. After discussion, consensus was reached that we should order an antenna for Q1 from Solinst at a cost of \$270 plus shipping. Mike and Bob will work out the details of payment and shipping.

- NFWF capacity-building grant: There is a wrap-up meeting with the consultant and a joint meeting with QWA and the consultant later today. The final project showcase is on December 17, but there is a possibility of the grant being extended into next year.
- Ecosystem Planning & Restoration, Bryan Seipp & Rich Starr
 - Hammer Creek Estates: Selected Flyway for construction. The bid came in a little under budget so money may be moved to Heisey. Scheduled start date is February 1 and construction should take about one month.
 - Heisey Farm: Pre-application meeting scheduled for December 17. May have additional construction funding left over from HCE.
 - Historic Schaefferstown Farm: 30% designs should be complete soon.
 - Barry Farm: LandStudies updated plans to fill in gullies, fill in abandoned channels, and reroute pipe draining rooftops to a different location. Rich is hopeful that revisions will be submitted to DEP this month for approval. IF DEP approves, LandStudies will make changes to design and permit application and will submit for permitting.

1. Monitoring Program

- A. Routine fieldwork. Katie Hollen is organizing our December monitoring fieldwork; the dates will be announced soon.
- B. Biological monitoring. Fieldwork organized by Katie Hollen and undertaken on Thurs. Nov. 6 and Sat. Nov. 8 at all six monitoring sites, with Katie, Lydia Mohn, and Hannah Hartman of the LCCD, Katie & Hannah's friends Riley Moore & Marisa Valotta, Master Watershed Steward Tony Shaw, and QWA volunteers Alyssa Bellucci, Bob Connell, Rick O'Leary, Michael Schroeder, and Gary Zelinski. Prof. Becky Urban at LVC has identified a student, Levi, who is eager to identify the collected macroinvertebrates in the lab.
- C. Equipment updates. The Solinst sensors continue to record data at five of our monitoring sites and upload data directly into our Water Quality Portal, except for the sensor at Q1 (Garfield), which does not get a signal. Bob Connell is communicating with tech support about an external antenna. The sensor at Bachman Run experienced a battery failure on November 3, but Bob replaced one of the three batteries and it is now in working order.

I skimmed the NFWF deliverables and have a couple comments-

- HOA Postcard_for printer.pdf - Personally, if we have a photo where I'm not making a weird face, I think that would be nice
- QWA Monitoring Program_for email.pdf (&for printer version) - The map shows unimpaired reaches. My guess is it shows recreational impairments. I think to be consistent with what we say on the brochure (which is that 100% of the stream miles are impaired), the map should include all impairment uses, and should thus show the whole watershed as impaired.
 - This comment applies to some of the maps in the "mapping" folder, as well
- QWA Volunteer PDs_final draft.pdf - for data management, time commitment says "Time Commitment: Ranges from 12 hours/month." That is not a range.
